Browser settings and NMplates.com updates

Because of the high frequency at which new material is added to the NMplates.com website, your internet browser settings may sometimes cause updates not to be displayed. If you suspect that you're not seeing all of the latest material for a given page, click the Reload/Refresh button on your browser while you're on the page of interest within the website.

A similar circumstance sometimes occurs on the Vintage Photos page:

Here, though, the solution is to go to your Browser History and clear the recent history while you're on the Vintage Photos main page (where you see the table of years). Usually clearing just the last hour of history will do the trick.

Keep in mind that not all browsers act the same in all circumstances.

We have also recently found two sets of county-by-county registration statistics recorded as of June 30, 1956, and June 30, 1958. The data is from the New Mexico Bureau of Revenue Biennial Reports for 1954-1956 and 1956-1958, respectively. These are also now on the aforementioned web page.

1954 Dealer Registration data

Among copies of documents recently obtained from State archival sources, and now digitized and filed in the NMTHP archives, is the registration information for 1954 Dealer plates, including all the dealers' names and addresses. All of the multi-plate registrations (i.e., 1D, 2D, 3D, 4D, etc., prefixes) are included. There are a surprising number of these, totaling some 870 in all. These records are not on NMplates.com at this time, but the information can be easily accessed for those who need it.
